FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

Victoria Barracks and the Anzac Memorial, Hyde Park – Thursday 30 May

This excursion commences with a visit to the historic Victoria Barracks, built during the 1840s, and base for the Australian Army during various military campaigns since then. The buildings offer a

superb example of colonial Georgian architecture maintained by Army Eastern Command. They include the parade ground, guard house, a main block, and a museum.

Following lunch at Paddington RSL Club, we will travel a short distance to Hyde Park where we will visit the recently refurbished Anzac Memorial. Built in 1934, the Memorial preserves the memory of Australians who have served their country in war and peace-keeping operations. The recently created museum includes items from the Boer war and from subsequent engagements.

Cost per person is \$65 and includes morning tea, lunch, guided tours, and transport. The bus will depart Bannockburn Oval, Pymble, at 8.00 am, returning about 4.30 pm. We will be required to submit attendee names, addresses, phone numbers, and ID which will be obtained from attendees by early May.

THIS Last month's guest speaker: Nicholas Cowdery

SPACE "Criminal Justice in NSW—Some Areas for Reform"

In March, we were pleased to welcome back Professor Nicholas Cowdery who has wowed us on several occasions with his insightful and enlightening presentations. On this occasion, he spoke on areas of reform where the NSW Government had not kept up to pace with community expectations. Topics addressed ranged from Drug (Pill) Testing to Euthanasia. As always, he brought the subject to light and gave comprehensive background on the issues (both in the community and within the legislature) which influenced the speed and commitment to drive the matters forward.

Our April speaker is Leigh Hatcher who will be well known to members as a veteran journalist and broadcaster on Australian radio from the 70's until 2013. He has a deep and intimate knowledge of Australian politics – having worked in the Canberra press gallery between 1975-1977 and 1981-1983.

He worked at the Seven Network in a range of capacities, including Canberra correspondent, Chief Olympic correspondent and European correspondent, based in London. He was also a senior presenter at Sky News for 13 years, as it led the whole emergence of 'the 24-hour news cycle'.

In 1998 he was forced out of work due to a devastating, two-year journey through the mysterious and painful condition known as Chronic Fatigue Syndrome. He wrote a best-selling book about the experience, "I'm Not Crazy, I'm Just a Little Unwell" Hence the title of today's presentation, "Personal Reflections on a Media Career impacted by Chronic Fatigue Syndrome"


